


Human Factors Tuition Self-Learning Package

In January 2016, SHOT introduced some human factors (HF) questions into the SHOT database (Dendrite). After analysing data from these questions, we realised reporters were not always able to assign scores against all four HF questions, so from January 2017 a learning package has been created to help reporters consider the HF aspects in their adverse incidents. This package includes real examples and examines how best to categorise and score the HF aspects. Phase 2: UK Haemovigilance reporting system

The next phase of the development to harmonise reporting and reduce duplication between MHRA and SHOT is scheduled to go-live at the end of March 2017. These modifications will introduce a link from SABRE directly into the SHOT database (Dendrite), which enables reporters to use a single log-in to report to both the MHRA and SHOT. This change should make reporting easier and more streamlined. A full guide to the changes will be provided to all reporters via e-mail before the new system goes live
